a very controversial thing. As I pointed out before,
I have found from my observations and my polls I have
taken a great many people against it. I don't feel that
the new Constitution, as important as it is, should be
jeopardized by inserting a controversial matter that
doesn't belong there in the first place.

intend to go into great detail about the arguments in favor of having a state-operated lottery. This is just incidental to the question before you. But I would like to point out that I have a list here of 81 foreign countries that have lotteries. I think it is out of place to have a provision in our new Maryland Constitution which goes against the trend, world-wide trend, which is going in favor of lotteries. We have all the European countries having lotteries. We have the Asian countries, African countries, the whole Western Hemisphere has lotteries except -- that includes, of course, South America -- except for the United States and Canada. As you know, we do have one state here which has authorized a lottery, New Hampshire. I might remark that the
