by the public by inserting it, not to put in a provision 1 that doesn't belong there, and I ask youto delete it 2 completely and make no reference to it in the new 3 Constitution. THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Pressman. Senator Hoff? MR. HOFF: No questions. ġ THE CHAIRMAN: I only have one or two. 9 Mr. Pressman. The first is this. I take it the main 10 thrust of your presentation here this afternoon is that 11 the prohibition against a lottery is just not of 12 Constitutional proportion, that it doesn't belong in the 13 Constitution because that kind of a controversial issue. 14 which is one that really should be decided by the prepre-15 sentatives of the people, ought to be left to their decision. 16 MR. PRESSMAN: That is right. 17 18 THE CHAIRMAN: And you are really not arguing the question of whether or not a lottery in and of itself 19 20 or vel non is a good idea or bad idea here today. We 21 know how youstand on it.
