MR. MILIS: I have given you a copy of the ı statement of Bishop Doll. Bishop Doll is not in the 2 city today. However, I am Executive Director of the 3 Division of Christian Social Relations for the Diocese 4 and I am here with his statement. I also will offer to 5 the Committee, I don't have it with me, we have other 6 material we will be glad to submit to you as to the 7 theological position in our opposition to the lottery 8 and also a copy of the resolution passed by our Executive 9 Council of the Diocese on January 20, 1964, opposing the 10 use of a lottery as a means of aiding the state in its 11 12 fiscal responsibility. THE CHAIRMAN: I think the Committee would be 1.3 very happy to have copies of all that material, Mr. Milds. 14 MR. MILLS: Before I read Bishop Doll's 15 statement, I have heard a remark here today that I have . 16 heard many times before as to the propriety of church 17 leaders and rectors addressing themselves to problems 18 of conscience in view of the fact that they do not 19 always speak for all of the members of their union. 20
