1 put ourselves in the position, if we consider a Bishop 2 or a Cardinal or a rector or a pastor, a pastor in the 3 sense of the word that it has been in the church, that he is the pastor to a flock, why then if we accept the 5 logic that I have heard advanced here, we enter the 6 unusual position of having the sheep lead the shepherd. I find this logic rather fallacious. Sometimes the sheep 8 are made to go in some directions for their own good 9 which is not necessarily the direction they would choose 10 if they had their own head. This is the statement made 11 by Bishop Doll.

"The appeal of a lottery is strong because nobody wants to raise taxes. Income from a lottery is described as easy money. This simply means, I do not have to pay the cost -- but somebody does.

"This is done by appealing to the base motives in man's nature, the desire to bet much for little, or better, to get something for nothing. For you to get something for nothing means a great many other people get nothing for something. There is basically no difference between appealing to man's greed in a lottery and the old
