I do want to make one other statement. Mr. 1 Pressman has referred to it already in regard to the 2 New Hampshire lottery. I hear him reading from the 3 Baptist Standard which is the Baptist state paper for the State of Texas. Dr. E. S. James is the editor. This 5 is from the February 16, 1966, issue of that paper. He quotes Religious News Service saying that the New Hampshire Sweepstakes, the only state-operated lottery in the 8 United States, was a flop this year. Opposed by 9 protestant leaders and sponsored by Governor John W. 10 11 King, the lottery system was legalized with the prediction it would produce great revenues and reduce the real 12 estate taxes of the people. In the second year of its 13 operation, it produced \$2,487,000 in taxes instead of the 14 \$5,000,000 predicted by the Governor. The lottery take 15 for the state amounted to \$24.15 per school pupil. 16 There was one other thing here I think that 17 we need to mention in connection with this that Mr. 18 Pressman did not mention in regard to the state-operated 19 lottery system. That is this: That the state-operated 20

lottery system did more than fall flat on producing
