the fourth estate is there in small numbers and, of course, if they are reporting on two houses, they are going to have that much more trouble reporting than in one house. I think this is the basic argument.

MR. SCANLAN: Yes, the press. I know we have a unicameral council in Montgomery County and the atmosphere is fairly thick with lobbyist influence. That wasn't so in the previous council. It depends, I think, in a good measure on the men involved.

I don't know whether the organizational structure either makes or mars the influence lobbyists exert on individual legislators. That depends on the quality of the person and how closely the electorate police them.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Mr. Chairman, does it also depend on the quality of the law thatyou have regarding lobbyists, whether or not you require them to register and keep a record of who is supporting them, who is financing them and the states --
