1	MR. ENEY: Do you think that would be true
2	if the Comptroller were not Louic Goldstein?
3	MR. GOLDSTEIN: It was true with Mr. Gordy
4	back in '22, Mr. Tawes and Mr. Lacy.
5	MR. ENEY: You didn't have these functions
6	when Mr. Gordy was Comptroller. You didn't have the
7	income tax function and sales tax function.
8	MR. GOLDSTEIN: During Governor Tawes' adminis-
9	tration, most of his people were not under the merit
10	system.
11	MR. NOSSEL: The tax divisions were created by
12	and large in 1935, which was during Mr. Gordy's term.
13	MR. ENEY: The first income tax account was
14	'37, and it really didn't get going until '59.
15	MR. NOSSEL: You had gross receipts tax and the
16	alcoholic beverages, et cetera, which came in in about
17	1934. Of course, you had the gasoline tax, which came
18	in in 1922 but was formed in '29.
19	MR. ENEY: I was thinking of the tax collection
20	functions that employ a lot of people.
21	MR. NOSSEL: In the early days, in the income
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
