1 and everything than before in the history of Maryland, 2 is that right? MR. NOSSEL: That is right. 4 MR. GOLDSTEIN: It is like one big family. We don't have quarrels, disagreements. We can sit down 5 in a matter of minutes and resolve any problem. We have a complete confidence in each other which has come about because of years of public service. MR. ENEY: We have never had an elected or any 10 kind of lieutenant-governor. Would your feelings still 11. be the same as to the Attorney General and Comptroller 12 if we were to have a lieutenant-governor? 13 MR, GOLDSTEIN: Yes. He will be the presiding 14 officer. 15 MR. ENEY: Maybe, but we don't know. What I meant, would you still feel the Comptroller and Attorney 16 17 General positions would be sort of a proving ground for 18 governor even if you had a lieutenant-governor position? 19 MR.
