1 This report goes to the General Assembly. It goes to 2 the Governor of Maryland. It is a complete report of 3 all the finances. All during the year, as I get the revenue picture, monthly, weekly, I send that off to the 5 Governor. The Governor has the same information about revenues as Louie Goldstein has, the same information I have. I feel it is my duty to keep the Governor informed. When I was the Floor Leader, I felt the Legislature didn't receive adequate information as to the State finances. 10 I had the law amended where the Legislature, from the 11 Board of Revenue Estimates receives these reports. As 12 we put our monthly reports out on revenues, every Member 13 of the Legislature gets that same information. I send 14 it to the Legislature, to the Governor, and we feel it 15 makes for a beeter system of government. Keep people 16 informed. Let them know the facts. 17 MR. SAYRE: Mr. Goldstein, personally, I 18 think that all of the people in Maryland have been blessed 19 by having you as Comptroller, so God bless you. 20 MR. GOLDSTEIN: Thank you, sir.
