that this is precisely the situation that does not exist 1 in Nebraska. There is not a close relationship between the 2 executive elected as a Democrat or Republican and the so-3 called partisan legislators, each of which is a king 4 unto himself, in his own domain. I question that claim. 5 DR. MICHENER: Not to pursue this any further, 6 since we will take it up later, the other big rebuttal that 7 the unicameralists make to the arguments against it ad-8 vanced by the bicameralists relates to the question of the need for a second review. 10 Unicameralists, not so much in this country as 11 in European countries, have said if you want a review, we 12 can still give it. We can set aside a portion of our 13 members as a reviewing body. Let them have independent 14

members as a reviewing body. Let them have independent review, but have an over-all decision made by a vote of the legislature as a whole. So that you have a review within the confines of a unicameral system.
