1	MR. GOLDSTEIN: In many places, I am sure.
2	THE CHAIRMAN: I thought that was the universal
3	law that nothing would repeal.
4	MR. SAYRE: There you propose something that
5	some people said wouldn't work. You have made it work, is
6	that right?
7	MR. GOLDSTEIN: That is right.
8	MR. SAYRE: That means also that if some other
. 9	proposition were proposed that isn't presently in being,
10	as being workable, it could possibly work, too, isn't
11	that possible?
12	MR. GOLDSTEIN: That is true in life of most
13	things. That is why they make a different kind of car
14	every day. That is why they are now wearing Italian
15	clothes instead of American made clothes.
16	MR. SAYRE: What I am suggesting, the fact we
17	have been blessed with the competence that you have pro-
18	vided, doesn't mean that we couldn't possibly arrange
19	for even something that would work better. That is
20	possible, wouldn't you admit?
21	MR. GOLDSTEIN: I would have to admit that.
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
