the Legislature dedicates specific taxes for specific 3 purposes and does this in a great many cases, then you are going to get a very rigid system of government which 5 is almost going to be or could be unmanagable, and he has 6 suggested that might be desirable to have a specific 7 provision in the Constitution which would prohibit the 8 General Assembly from doing this. Is that what you ask? MR. SAYRE: Yes, as far as to new taxes. 10 MR. GOLDSTEIN: I think that whole situation 11. is sound unless you had a dire emergency that you couldn't 12 anticipate today. Today we live in the Atomic Age, Space 13 Age. 14 MR. SAYRE: You get a lot of things under 15 those circumstances. 16 MR. GOLDSTEIN: That is right.
