be tied up. Mr. Eney is here and some other lawyers here 1 that know they can come to the Orphans Court at any 2 time, sit down, have a conference, if it be 9 o'clock 3 or after five, and get matters straightened out. I again say with my experience in the 5 Court, my experience as a lawyer, that it would just 6 pile up work, testamentary work, that is running smoothly. 7 I can't understand myself why the Court that is running 8 smoothly and the work is done, why there should be a 9 change. If it can be proven to me or my associates 10 that by abolishing the Court the work would be done 11 better, would be done faster, trials could be had, I will 12 go along with it. But to this point with my experience 13 in the Court, I can't see any abolishing or merging of 14 the Court would help the lawyers or especially the laymen. 15 During my campaign, I am rambling now, but during my 16 campaign I heard Municipal Court Judges who became 17 Municipal Court Judges lately, that they see more people 18 for the first time than any other Court in the State. 19 I disagree with them. I feel that we see more laymen in 20 one week, giving them help and aid, than any Court in the 21
