1 Orphans Court. 2 Therefore, you see, I am the junior in service on the Orphans Court. Until the report of this 3 Committee on the Judiciary Department of the Constitutional Convention Commission, I had not realized that trials 5 in absentia existed in the United States. I look at the names on this Committee and in agreement with the Chief Judge, we don't always agree, they are notable 8 because of their absence from the Court. I wondered 9 about this and considering the fact you have already 10 made your recommendation and probably nothing we can 11 say will change it, I would like your indulgence for a 12 13 few comments. One member of the Committee is very well 14 acquainted with the Court, both in theory and in practice, 15 Melvin J. Sykes. His father was Chief Judge at least 16 beginning in 1940, that's as far back as I got, probably 17 further than that, who was a great scholar. Chief Judge 18 of the Court, unlike these county courts, or the Orphans 19 Court of Baltimore City has been comprised of lawyers 20 21 since before 1940. In deference to pleading our own cause,
