some of the other states, where the legislature meets for 1 a short period of time and recesses and comes back and 9 recesses again and operates all year through, it would 3 probably be something different than we have in Maryland. When you have a continuous operation of the Maryland 5 General Assembly, it is entirely different than when you 6 have a weekly operation. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: We are going to get into the 8 factor of whether this body believes in the work papers 9 there ought to be some descriptive statement concerning a 10 continuing body of the legislature or by various sessions, 11 such as you described a few moments ago.
