This report contained a stinging dissent
by one of the, in my humble opinion, great judges of the
Court of Appeals, Judge Neal Parke. He dissented from
the major conclusions and recommendations of the Commission and in particular concerning the reduction in
number of the Court of Appeals.

Gentlemen, I mention this to you for this reason. Looking at the membership of this Commission and their descendents are here tonight, some of them, it certainly was comprised of able, well intentioned lawyers. But the recommendations, like many things in life, have not seen the light of day. If you will read this report, you can find it in the 1943 edition of the transactions of the Maryland State Bar Association, 48th Annual Meeting, if you will read that concerning the Orphans Court, I defy any fair minded man to come to any conclusion other than the abolition of the Orphans Courts of the State of Maryland was heartily recommended by this Commission composed of goodlawyers and gentlemen for a basic reason, and that is the condition of the county courts with which I wasn't concerned until I read
