I can't give you an exact answer. I think definitely, 3 from my experience, that the Orphans Court should not be merged or consolidated in any court in big metropolitan 5 areas, any Supreme Bench or Circuit Court or any one of 6 the courts you want to call it. 7 I would say if the Committee feels that the 8 9 Orphans Court as it is today in Baltimore City is not doing the job, it could be done better, lo: and behold, 10 11 I shouldn't try to persuade you, but my feeling is that 12 one judge cannot handle the Orphans Court work in 13 Baltimore City. A minimum of two judges. When I talked to Mr. Eney, again I say that if they had one judge, you 14 might wind up with two and three masters, which I, 15 as an attorney, fear. I would like to see three judges, 16 not masters. I am not again saying that we have a 17 Master in Equity, I am not personally saying anything 18 about him, I would rather, as a lawyer, deal with a 19 judge when the judge has time than deal with the 20 21 master in between and then go to the judge.
