There are statistics to show as to MR. ENEY: 1 in how many instances there are changes made and how many? 2 DR. WINSLOW: Yes. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: I think it would be interesting and important for our resource person to dig this up, our 5 researcher, Mr. Eney. 6 MR. ENEY: I think it would be very interesting. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: You folks may want to make note 8 of this, but perhaps Dr. Graves and Dr. Wheeler and Mr. 9 Kentner will get into this. So, let us move to Dr. Graves, 10 and we want to thank you again, sir, for taking time from 11 a busy schedule to be with us. 12 DR. GRAVES: Mr. Chairman, members of the 13 Committee, it is hardly necessary for me to say, I suppose, 14 that I am not here as a representative of the library, 15 although I happen to be employed there.
