MR. SYKES: Very back-handed way of doing 1 2 it. "Since the judicial power JUDGE FRIEDMAN: 3 of the state is exclusively vested in these four courts. the omission of reference to Orphans Courts, as the same 5 are known today, means they will be abolished." 6 THE CHAIRMAN: We can agree that is an 7 unfortunate way of putting it. 8 MR. ENEY: I think perhaps the Orphans Court has more purely ex parte matters than any other 10 court in the area of guardianships where there is no 11 lawyer and there is no other side. Does this, in your 12 thinking, pose any particular problem? Isn't it just 13 a matter of a judge exercising judgment and discretion? 14 This doesn't require a plurality of judges, does it? 15 JUDGE FRIEDMAN: No. I divide it up. 16 In guardianship cases you usually get money into a 17 guardianship case from an estate where there is property 18 plus money. You get it from a settlement. We have a 19 tremendous amount of settlements, accident work, damage 20 settlements where there are minors. You can go up into 21
