have hearings and devote time to some more serious 2 problems, probate problems. I don't know if I was correct but I think that's probably what you were driving at. 5 MR. ENEY: That's what I had in mind. As an Equity Master does now, he doesn't act, he recommends 7 to the judge to act. I was thinking in this area of 8 guardianships you might have a master who would take 10 the initial conference and make a recommendation to the 11 judge. 12 JUDGE FRIEDMAN: As I said before, Mr. Eney. I am not in favor of masters. Not in experience 13 14 but I would rather see a judge even at that level. you don't want to call him a judge equal to the Supreme 15 16 Bench of Baltimore City, I would rather see a judge with 17 that authority than a master. For example, if you take a petition for 18 fee or something up to the master, he says, I am going 19
