The only way you can do a good job for probate or testamentary work is to be experienced and stay in the court and administer that type work.

MR. HARGROVE: As the Judiciary Act is set up, I suppose you almost have to have a probate section or division in many of the larger counties, Montgomery, Prince Georges, Baltimore County. Would it make any difference if a judge is assigned to probatwork there and is assigned to Baltimore City, because you refer to vacation, such as proposed under the judiciary act? That is, the Chief Judge has authority to assign a judge to virtually any section of the state really.

JUDGE FRIEDMAN: No, again I say --

MR. HARGROVE: In other words, you would be satisfied as long as the Judge coming in was competent in the field of probate?

JUDGE FRIEDMAN: No, I still say I am
personally against consolidating or merging the
Orphans Court, not talking about counties, talking about
the Orphans Court of Baltimore City, into the Supreme
Bench as it is now. I say I am not against raising the
