tremendous campaign, with the help of some of his supporters, but still a tremendous performance for a man of
his age; and when the election day came and the votes were
in, George Norris had won.

Now, what did he want? The main thing was that 5 he was steamed up about this conference committee business 6 which seemed to him just an abomination in the sight of 7 Now, there could have been conference committee 8 abuses, of course, many times and in many jurisdictions, 9 but this seemed to me to be a pretty small item to seize 10 upon to make such a business out of. Well, anyhow, when 11 the vote was over in Nebraska, we had a tremendous surge 12 of interest throughout the country. There were a lot of 13 interesting things told about what happened at that time. 14 Senator Toll, Henry Toll, a friend of mine, 15

was out there and, of course, at that time he was director of the council for state government. He went to Lincoln when the new legislature was inaugurated and he was walking along the streets there in the capitol with Senator Norris -- and this illustrates a point that I tried to

make, that so much of our reaction to this business has
