extensive contacts with legislators in many states. 1 don't know very many now personally, but I did know quite 2 a few for a period of time due to my connection with the 3 Council and then, after World War II, when we were setting 4 up the National Legislative Council Conference; in the 5 course of these years, I talked with many legislators 6 about this and, of course, the ones who take part in 7 Council activities in the National Legislative Conference 8 and such organizations are, for the most part, the cream 9 of the crop and very, very few of them were favorably 10 11 disposed to unicameralism. 12 You might say it was because they were familiar with the other system. I don't think it was only that. 13 I couldn't help feeling, though, that their experience, 14 and these were the more able members of the legislative 15 fraternity, I couldn't help but feel that their views 16 were entitled to some serious consideration. 17 Nebraska adopted it and the thing was successful there 18 and has been, and I think there is no argument on that 19 20 whatsoever.
