department of the university for many years wrote a 1 commentary at the end of the first unicameral session, 2 in which he reported that this session demonstrated an 3 absence of hasty legislation, a simplified and smoothly 4 working procedure; a better personnel, the liberation of 5 the legislature from the domination of the Governor as the 6 titular head of his party, and the leaders of the political 7 parties and the general publicity by means of which the Я unilateral legislature had revived, as it were, an interest 9 of the people of the State in their law-making body. 10 won't elaborate on that because that is a report of an 11 evaluation of the Nebraska experience. 12 After World War II, there wasn't much agitation 13

then for this change, but the model constitution continued to recommend it. The American Political Science Association's committee on American legislatures was published with a very favorable attitude toward unicameralism, and
