I wonder, procedurally, if we were to take, let us say before we open up this for discussion, if we would take no more than ten minutes, and I don't want in any sense to state this will be our procedure, but it is a possibility, for a break and to bring up here our own sandwiches and coffee which we can get downstairs and then continue and pursue this while we are having our sandwich and coffee, and while we hear from Mr. Kentner and Dr. Wheeler.

We have brought Mr. Kentner here as a native of Nebraska who will bring together some of this history Dr. Graves has described with a good deal of vividness and personal relationship up to date, because I am sure he, like I, couldn't help but to think of the great debate that went through the State of Nebraska as to whether they should even put a bust in that statuary hall where they have the bust of Lincoln; after thirty years, this occurred. So, he is still a symbol.
