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MR. RATCHFORD: Caroline.

DR. BURDETT: Yes, you went to Caroline. However, I think this should cut the work down, and you have to realize, Miss Spencer, talking about the magnitude of this thing, spent nearly two years in her analysis. It is a very complex subject.

IR. THOMPSON: Mr. Chairman, I should mention that just yesterday I heard that there will be introduced into the general assembly a proposed constitutional amendment which will provide for the consolidation of municipalities at the will of any two or three or number of adjoining municipalities which would decide to merge. That would be a factor.
