may get uniform action, but the clique has already gotten in its activities at another stage. Certainly, the Democratic party in Maryland has had its factions which have been able to control committee action where the chairman of a committee represents the interests of a particular area of the state.

So that you have geographical units here which have defied the action of the majority.

MR. SCANLAN: Well, I think that's true in

intermittent matters, but I think Dr. Bard is right. In Maryland, the Covernor and his leadership over a period of eight years, whether one agreed or disagreed with him, generally stood in the minds of the people as the people responsible for getting through a legislative program, and I am sure there have been rebellions both on the part of legislators in the General Assembly, or on the part of Democrats in other parts of the State, but there was no question there was one group we could look to for exercising, as you put it, continued responsibility over the term.

Now, how does Governor Morrison handle that out
