forth that come about by reason of that very factual change and, in order to more or less be flexible to contend and cope with those complexities, intergovernmental agreement would certainly be something that would come within the scope of the actual constitutional provision that we would write.

We do not have one in the Constitution at the present time. We do have a provision for intergovernmental relations in the suggested models, but actually our present Constitution is barren insofar as providing for any such thing, and it seems to me that that is certainly one of the best ways of coping with the problem and the overflowing of those problems from one municipality into the other and county into city and actually even across state boundaries.

So, if such an amendment has been introduced,

I think the analysis or the assignment of this particular
phase of our research should well include determining
what if anything has been done and is being done in the
Legislature along the line of governmental change and
administrative setup.
