wouldn't say it was the majority sentiment, for a unicameral legislature; but the argument was raised, if we propose this thing, people are not going to adopt it and this will adversely affect other parts of the constitution.

I am not so sure. I mean, this is a matter of drawing a line, that politicians are better able to draw than I am. My only experience in politics resulted in a two to one vote that I should remain a professor of I say don't underestimate the people and don't settle for less than you can get from them.

I think reform is in the air. I think, as Dr. Graves has said, we have an opportunity now that we may not have again for a long, long time, to bring about some fundamental changes. I know in my own State of Virginia, we are undergoing really a revolution. Four years ago, the dominant philosophy was, in state government, we've got so much money, what can we do with it? This year, the theme is, we've got all these things we want to do; how are we going to raise the money to do it? And, in Virginia, this is a revolution, I think, Brooke, and I think the same kind of thing is taking place elsewhere.
