THE CHAIRMAN: Well, we really have finished right on the button and we have these people to thank. I know that this leads us directly into the two questions which we used as a basis for opening and that is where do we stand in connection with the subject and, secondly, irrespective of whether we hold one position as superior to the other as a committee, where do we stand in respect to whether we shall include both of these issues in the working papers; and here, as I understand it, we must submit this question to the Commission as a whole and it will be with this question that we shall open up Wednesday's meeting and then, hopefully, I guess through some other questions that we ought to submit, such as the one dealing with whether our reapportionment position be one of specifics, such as the constitution now includes, or will it be more in line with the kind of generalized, ceiling and floor position, with regard to representation, which the model includes.
