because we are now again touching upon the area where 1 great controversy can certainly arise and has to be solved in one way or another, and we are touching upon special commissions and we are touching upon special purpose districts and all manner and sundry related prob-5 lems. DR. BURDETT: I use this word control very looselv. It illustrates the point you are making that home rule should not serve to prevent some forms of 9 coordination and one which is fairly uncontroversial was 10 brought up at a luncheon meeting at the Maryland Municipal 11

League in Baltimore, in which Schator Malkus made the remark that he felt it is very important in Maryland for the Bar, if for no one else, and it is for others, that

we have a law in this State which requires the publication

of municipal ordinances in some kind of a single reference set. So that, if some of you are practicing at the Bar, you can find out what home rule provisions under the

present Constitution have been enacted, lct's say for Takoma Park.
