court of Denver, Colorado. All of those are by constitutional provision or by statute. Then, in addition, it is being used on a voluntary basis in the City of New York by Mayor Lindsay, now following along after Mayor Wagner. And the latest addition of the list is Puerto Rico, where Puerto Rico's new Governor Sanchez Valega has established a commission, on a voluntary basis, to advise him. So, there are pretty close to a dozen states which actually are using them and eight or nine of them by law.

MR. MARTINEAU: Did you mention Kansas?

MR. WINTERS: I guess I missed Kansas there,
with respect to the Supreme Court.

THE CHAIRMAN: How many of those states also have the non-competitive election?

MR. WINTERS: All right. That is in use in Missouri, Kensas, Iowa, Nebraska, Alaska, Florida, to the extent I mentioned, and then Illinois, which does not have the other feature, the county court of Denver, Colorado, the Utah juvenile courts have the nominating commission, but they have reappointment rather than the
