moment familiar with exactly what they did, but in 1 essence, they had to get --2 MR. MARTINEAU: My understanding of the 3 arrangement was, in order to obtain the support of the political parties to back these men, that the Governor 5 had appointed, he had to promise not to use this 6 advisory commission on future judicial appointments. 7 That is my understanding of it. 8 MR. WINTERS: I do not believe that back-9 10 fired. He may have done it. 11 MR. MARTINEAU: Isn't it true he no longer 12 uses the advisory commission to make his judicial appointments and the political party supported the ap-13 14 pointees for election to office? 15 MR. WINTERS: They did support these appointeds and I do not believe he has used the commission again. 16 I am not aware that he has pledged himself to them. 17 18 That may not be. 19 MRS. EOTHE: What about the middle possibility 20 of having legislation which would accomplish the purpose, 21 but not have constitutional provision?
