MR. WINTERS: That is the type of commission 1 that has had the most experience, and I think that the 2 experience with that has been good. When I say the 3 most experience, there still has not been enough experience for anybody to be very sure that the last word 5 has been found. I am not sure that it could not be improved on. 7 MR. CORY: All of these nominating commission 8 members are appointed or are some of them chosen some 9 other way? 10 MR. WINTERS: Well, in all that I know of, the 11 laymen are appointed. Lawyer members tend to be elected 12 by the bar association or by the whole membership of the 13 In Missouri that is the same thing. In fact, I 14 do not know of any instance in which they are elected 15 by the bar association, when there is a difference --36 for example, the State of Iowa does not have a unified 17 bar as Missouri does, but they do not use the association. 18 The Supreme Court has a system for polling all lawyers 19 without regard to association. 20 MR.
