for disability or misconduct, then the actual length of term does not matter very much.

THE CHAIRMAN: But if you have a competitive election, is there any thought on the length of term that you have in a competitive election?

MR. WINTERS: Then I would tend to favor
longer terms because of the inability to get any qualified lawyer with a good practice, to give up his practice
and go on the bench for a short term with the prospect
of being beaten at the next election.

MR. CORY: I would think it would be certainly difficult to get.

MRS. BOTHE: May we have your comment on the desirable methods of removal of judges for physical or mental disability or competence?

MR. WINTERS: Well, of course, impeachment, which is the only thing available in most of the states, is woefully inadequate and I do not think enybody questions that. And the best system that has been devised was the one that was adopted in California in 1960, which established a commission on judicial
