a staff which is constantly available to answer the 1 phone every day of the year, or every business day. 2 And then the third is the Supreme Court. Now, the 3 staff does routine investigations and reports to the commission. The commission decides which are important Б enough to be pursued. And many things are handled by 6 the commission, but recommendations for actual removal 7 come from it to the Supreme Court, which it alone has 8 the power to remove. So, there are three. 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Getting back to this question 10 of term, do you see any particular reason for distinguish-11 ing between term of the appellate court and that of the 12 trial courts? 13

MR. WINTERS: Well, I have often wondered about that. I think there is quite a general practice to give the appellate court judges longer terms. I do not know of any particular basis for it.

MR. MARTINEAU: My own theory on it is that the effect of a judge who turns sour for one reason or another during the course of his term is much greater in a trial court where he is the only judge who is
