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which he passes upon education should have educational standards. It should be educational standards, but in another way, it should be set up and required for every public official who in any way passes upon the processes of education.

Furthermore -- and I won't take your time this morning, and I can certainly say this without any feeling whatsoever. My personal relationships with the governors of Maryland and particularly with the legislature have been most pleasant, but we have in Maryland, according to a statement made to me by one of the most distinguished judges that I have known in this State, is that we have the most rigid executive budget, which means that nothing can be put in the budget except those things required by law, unless the executive approves it; and if you want to raise one cent, for instance, the salary of any individual in Maryland, in any position, you've got to pass a special act of the legislature, which means a terrific amount of control in the hands of one or two individuals who often are advised -- and this is quite impersonal -- who are often advised by people
