with respect to education.

I am not quite clear just what you advocate in this regard. Let me ask you specifically as to certain areas. It has been suggested that the Governor's control over State agencies should be greater than it is now and that many independent boards should be made advisory only and the head of the department under that board be made accountable directly to the Governor. If that were applied to the Department of Education and the State Board of Education would become advisory and the Superintendent of Education would be responsible to the Governor rather than to the board, would you think that desirable or undesirable?

DR. PULLEN: I think that is the most dangerous thing you can possibly do to public education in the
country. Alaska has done it, Hawaii did it. Mr.

Byrd did that in Virginia. As soon as he became Governor
the first thing he did was to make the Superintendent
appointed by the Governor. You simply make a sycophant
out of a professional. You simply put your whole professional career in the hands of a politician. I say
