MR. ENEY: You said they can raise now only if they provide a special tax.

DR. PULLEN: That is exactly right, but what I did say was this, that if the Governor puts -- he decides, and this is not an attack on any individual, gentlemen. This is on government. I don't think the whole educational system of the State, the salaries of all the people should be determined by one man, and that is exactly what it is, particularly if you've got the work and the control of the legislature that the Governor of Maryland has.

MR. ENEY: Again, I am not clear. Are you suggesting that this control be vested in the legislature or in the Regents, in the case of the University of Maryland, or in the State Board of Education, in the case of the public schools?

DR. PULLEN: I would say no. I think the legislature is the final authority and I would say this, that the greatest criticism, and I've had forty-some years of experience in the State of Maryland and I think it's the greatest place in the world, we're civilized and
