details so specifically that you cannot rely on the good sense and the good judgment of those who might be holding public office.

As I look at Article 43 -- let me go back just a bit. I would urge, too, that in the drafting of any constitution, and I don't know of any constitutional convention that has ever done this, that somewhere along the line a good editor be brought into the act, someone who knows how to write, who does look at this from an editorial point of view, so that it is in a well-written manner. I think this is very critical because this does avoid some ambiguities and inconsistencies that frequently creep into these documents.

Looking at Article 43, I was quite interested in this. This presumably states the purpose, the reasons why we need a public school system, and I find one, to me, at least, one purpose of public education conspicuous by its absence and I would presume to suggest to this Committee that consideration be given to the idea of including in this section the idea that public education is important in the development of effective
