citizenship and the transmission from generation to
generation of what we, I think, would call our democratic
heritage. I find no mention of this at all in Article
4 43, and I certainly consider this to be as important as,
shall we say the promotion of manufacturers or agriculture or something of that sort.
I would also suggest perhaps that this be

written in simpler and more precise terms. This is one of the reasons why I think of the need for good editing. I hold up as an example the preamble to our Federal Constitution, we, the people. I think we all know what that says. It says it succinctly, it says it clearly and it has withstood the test of time.

I'm a little curious as to why there should be included in Article 43 of the Declaration of Rights the sentence which has to do with, or the stipulation, really, regarding the assessment of farmland. I can see where certain individuals and certain groups might feel this is an im-

portant stipulation. I really question, not so much its inclusion in the document, but rather its inclusion in
