number of state constitutions that include phrases or clauses, and even in the case of, I think it is Missouri

THE CHAIRLADY: Massachusetts, with regard to Harvard.

DR. BARD: Well, Massachusetts has a large description as to the role of Harvard, et cetera, and Missouri actually goes into the community college law of Missouri at this time, and that is a fairly recent one. Would you include in the Constitution any statement with respect to higher education?

DR. PULLEN: I thought I touched on that,
Dr. Bard. Yes, I would. I don't know exactly how I
would write it, but I should certainly provide for the
establishment, the proper conduct of and so on. Then
I would write in there a provision -- I think this is a
general provision with respect to education, but it cuts
across all government -- that no function of government
shall be denied to any individual, to any qualified
individual for any reason whatsoever.

I am trying to get the point over here that in Maryland we are denying higher education to people
