because of the cost. 1 THE CHAIRLADY: You feel there should be a 2 constitutional provision that all State-supported schools 3 be open without charge to all qualified people? DR. PULLEN: Theoretically, in principle, 5 yes, I agree with that. 6 7 THE CHAIRLADY: Do you think it is feasible to have such provision, economically feasible? 8 9 DR. PULLEN: Yes. I go further than that, I think the same thing would apply to kindergartens and 10 11 nursery schools. 12 THE CHAIRLADY: And this should be in the Constitution itself? 13 The only reason you do not --14 DR.
