Maryland, was this not resolved with your approval, cooperation and perhaps it might have originated in the office of the Superintendent?

DR. PULLEN: That was done before, with Governor Ritchie and Mr. Cook and other people in the State, and it started with, and it started 100 years ago with Dr. VanBockler and Horace Manns, but it was written into law in 1922; but Dr. Goodnough who was the chairman of the commission who wrote the school laws of Maryland, which are considered as one of the finest in the country, spelled out the protection against the manipulation of that by anyone.

Let's go back to government again. I agree with Thomas Jefferson when he said that all government must be founded upon suspicion. Everybody, statesmen, every individual elected or appointed in the public schools should be under suspicion by the people who put them there. That is, I think, a truism, almost, in government, not predicated upon trust, but predicated upon suspicion that the frailties of human nature may cause him to do things that are not in the interest of
