15 THE CHAIRLADY: A question by Dr. Bard?

16 DR. BARD: May I ask a question as a member
17 of the Commission? Dr. Pullen, not just now, but some-
18 time, if in this writing you could present to the Com-
19 mission your analysis as to how the various provisions
20 in Section 52 of Article 3 -- and I say this as Chairman
21 of the Legislative Department Committee which has
