I think that is very simply what was behind that. We worked in 1960 to get this included and, as I say, my guess is it was there because of the Constitution of either 1851 or 1864.

I would like to direct my remarks just a little bit to Section 3 of Article 8. I have a quotation here, and I will not read it, but in Kentucky they had this same experience. The surplus funds which was given to the various states in 1837, Maryland got some of this, as did Kentucky, and they immediately began to divert that money to other purposes; and there seems to be this tendency in a number of states. Dr. Pullen has completely covered this and I think I need not belabor it, but most of the people know something about this from the history of education and their own experience. I gave to Dr. Pullen -- he took it out with him -- House Bill No. 94, which is not the school fund itself, but, as you know, there is a bill in the legislature at the moment that, if passed, would give the State Roads Commission authority to enter into agreements with the retirement systems to buy land.
