This is one of the illustrations which you have to deal with in the attempt to use school moneys for other purposes, and I think the retirement system is in a sense school money, although not part of the educational fund itself. And we have this experience in two other directions. One is the gasoline tax. There is a tendency once in a while to divert it from its main purpose, and also in the national government in the highway funds, you have a tendency to divert those funds which are directed to a particular purpose.

So, I would address my remarks to this and then generally and simply say that I would endorse, I think, everything that Dr. Pullen said. I would emphasize the matter of this control by the legislature in this, as being representative of the people. I told Dr. Cook back there, I think Dr. Henry Cooper, who was a professor of political science in Princeton, several years ago when all this dated back to putting tremendous authority in the hands of the governor, he sounded a warning way back there that this was a tendency for one person to control or a few people to control the State.
