flu today, it seems to be going around, and he asked if I would appear here and speak briefly on an item that pertains particularly to the Constitution and to the University of Maryland.

This whole matter of education is one that I think we all attempt to find a way in which we can discharge our responsibilities with a reasonable degree of direct responsibility within the institution and yet, at the same time, the responsiveness or the approach of full inspection, full review by the people, by the legislature, by all who are concerned with State government. Specifically, I would like to talk about the possibility of the Constitution containing authority for the University of Maryland as an institution, authority for its Board of Regents to govern the affairs of the institution. I would like to say also that I am speaking here as a representative of the administration of the university. We would like to submit actually a position paper from the Board of Regents itself and I believe we will be in a position to do that after the March 25th meeting.
