universities, in the state college case and the junior college, I think this is a little different. The opportunity to govern tends to get over to the city and county there.

I would only say this one thing, and I hope you would shoot it at me any way you wish, Dr. Bard, because you know I have a very high opinion of your leadership in the total effort. I believe generally speaking this kind of autonomy leads to efficiency in any institution, if you have responsible leadership. I believe that when it is given to an institution, it takes a good period of pretty careful leadership to actually do all of the things that are involved in fully utilizing it. I have some feeling that any move toward this type of constitutional autonomy for the university would inevitably lead to much more legislative autonomy for other units and there may be something in the evolution nature which we have now lived under legislative autonomy in the past ten or twelve years that might place us in an unusual position to actually utilize this constitutional authority.
