somewhat separated behind an ivory tower, if you will, this is becoming so much lessened in time and the terms of one knowing the other and the dispersible knowledge. Where you are creating new facts, you run much more frequently into this desire to control the destiny of the institution, if these facts aren't in conformity with the general present opinion. Obviously, of course, we're in very, very heavy research activity. More than other institutions.

THE CHAIRLADY: Our stenographer needs a two-minute break and perhaps other people do, as well.

(At this point there was a short recess.)

THE CHAIRLADY: All right, Dr. Kuhn.
